# PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

SFSI offered a variety of programs in the 2023-2024 school year.

#### Fall Seed Walk. September 30, 2023

Take a walk with Bob Sivinski, former state botanist, and Mollie Parsons, environmental educator, to learn abouty the plants in our region and their seeds. This class will focus on plant identification and how to incoporate boatany into your classroom.

#### Science Literacy, November 11, 2023

Engaging students with non-fiction texts is important. This workshop will explore reading efficiently to find information, understanding core concepts, and being able to show what has been learned in multiple written and graphic formats.

#### Schoolyard Birding, January 27, 2024

(Canceled due to illness) Enjoy learning about common birds with simple observation and identification activities with Katie Weeks, Director of Education and Audubon Southwest. Explore inquiry activities from habitat to feeders. Find new ways to use observational data and contribute to community science in your classroom.

## Bring Biology to Life in the Dead of Winter, February 10, 2024

Olivia Carril will explore cross-cutting concepts that engage learners in K-8 about the natural world when it is too cold for birdwatching, too early to grow a garden, and the ground is too frozen for earthworms.

## Project Wet, Getting Little Feet Wet, March 2, 2024

Getting Little Feet Wet activities are designed for early childhood teachers, pre-k through first or second grade. This workshop provides action and science-focused water education using diverse water topics to inspire educators to teach young children through objective, experiential activities that support a water sustainable future.


## Calder's Art: Movement and Balance, April 13, 2024


Explore how art, science, and math are interconnected in this hands-on mobile and stabile workshop focused on Calder and his kinetic art.
